Subject: Bayshore Heritage Byway – CMC/CMP Meeting #3 Agenda

On February 16, 2012 we will hold the third Corridor Management Committee meeting for the Bayshore Heritage Byway corridor planning process. The first meeting provided an introduction to the scenic byways program and the corridor management planning process. We discussed the corridor and how it will be defined, and we completed an exercise aimed at developing an overall vision for the byway and set of management goals. At the second meeting we discussed the significance of the byway's intrinsic qualities and how they contribute to national designation. The assessment of intrinsic qualities together with the visual, physical and institutional survey results served as the background for a discussion of management strategies for conserving and preserving the many resources within the byway corridor. These included developing key partnerships, leveraging funding and monitoring change (i.e. staying on top of planned projects, knowing what is coming down the pipeline).

At the third meeting, the CMC will work with the consultants (L/KLA and MT) to identify areas in need of physical improvement such as gateways to communities, trailheads along the byway, potential locations for waysides and pullouts, and potential corridor-wide or other community-based enhancement needs. Enhancements will include both physical improvements and the discussion of how the byway should address future development and growth, especially at the edges of existing towns and cities.
